



CUAP PROVIDER BEST PRACTICE STANDARDS

As a member of CUAP, each provider organization makes a commitment to follow the standards below, to ensure that our association sets the bar for quality, ethical practice of Applied Behavior Analysis in our state.

- We agree to abide by the provisions set forth by the Department of Occupational Licensing (DOPL) for Licensed Behavior Analysts (R156-61a. <https://rules.utah.gov/publicat/code/r156/r156-61a.htm>) and Utah Department of Health and Human Services ABA Agency Licensing (<https://dlbc.utah.gov/human-services/licensed-providers/>).
- We agree to abide by the Behavior Analysis Certification Board (BACB) guidelines and provisions, including the Professional and Ethical Compliance Code (<https://www.bacb.com/ethics/ethics-code/>), not only as individual behavior analysts, but in the practices of our entire organization.
- We agree to follow the Applied Behavior Analysis Treatment of Autism Spectrum Disorder: Practice Guidelines for Healthcare Funders and Managers for the delivery of Autism intervention services (<https://www.casproviders.org/asd-guidelines>)
- We support our state association for behavior analysis (UtABA), as well as other associations who strive to educate and increase quality among practitioners.
- We commit to providing each other professional courtesy and respect. This could occur during the transition of a client or employee, or in alerting an organization of a problem that they may not be aware of.
- We agree to hold ourselves to the highest standards, and to set the example for quality, ethical service delivery. Member organizations of CUAP do not simply do the minimum that is expected by a governing authority; instead, we implement our own internal systems of quality assurance, compliance with regulations, and mechanisms by which we monitor our own performance and adherence to best practices.
